

WCHA Do It Yourself (DIY) Non Pro Halter Classes

This program is designed to reward amateur and youth participants who take a hands-on approach in preparing and showing their horses, fostering a spirit of self-reliance and personal involvement.

Exhibitors who meet the requirements for the WCHA DIY program may enter the following classes:

- Non Pro Yearling Mares – All Breed
- Non Pro Yearling Colts (Yearling Stallions/Geldings Combined) – All Breed

Rules and Conditions

- Exhibitors must be either an Amateur or a Youth and hold a current WCHA membership.
- All participants must comply with family relationship and horse ownership requirements to be eligible. Leasing a horse is not permitted.
- Exhibitors must never have received payment for training, fitting, or showing horses owned by others. Exhibitors with family members who have ever been a trainer or judge are not eligible to participate.
- Participants must first **enroll their horse in the program by February 15**. From this date until the show, the exhibitor is solely responsible for the training, care, and preparation of their horse.
- Horses may not be boarded at any training facility from February 15th until the date of the show. Additionally, horses cannot be kept at any facility where a trainer is actively training horses.
- Prior to competing, exhibitors may receive assistance with clipping, grooming, or hoof blacking from family members or other non pros, but not from professional trainers or groomers.
- A professional bander is permitted to do the mane and tail at events where the horse is shown.
- Routine veterinarian and farrier services are allowed; however, the DIY exhibitor must be present during these procedures. Horses may receive treatments such as neck slimming ultrasounds or lasers, as permitted for other non pros, provided the exhibitor is present.
- Exhibitors may seek “general” verbal advice on showing or grooming from other non pros or professionals, but NO Hands On Guidance that might include visual of horse or sharing of pictures or videos.
- Absolutely No Verbal Coaching allowed from the sidelines while the class is being judged.
- In the event of an emergency, assistance may be provided to a DIY horse or exhibitor by anyone.
- ***All entries must also participate in their respective AQHA/APHA breed class within the WCHA Supreme Championship Show. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of all winnings from these classes.***
- ***By entering this class I pledge to abide by all conditions and rules of the class, I understand that failure to comply are grounds for suspension by World Conformation Horse Association.***
